TRUST AGM

Due to COVID reports within our immediate community the Trust has made the decision to hold its AGM 12th February 2022. DRIVER LICENSES

We advise that grants for Learner Licenses has been fully allocated for this financial year. Funding however is still avialable for RESTRICTED and FULL. Whanau will need to contact Te Arangi at the office should they wish to access funding to help sit either their restricted or full license in 2022. In the meantime you can apply on the Trust website for a Discretionary grant to be considered for this funding.

Hakaraia Education Grants & the Te Houhou Health Scholarship are now open and close 17 January 2022. No exceptions. Please do not leave your application to the last minute. Any application past the closing date will be declined. Whanau can apply online through the Trust website, or via TKOW mobile APP.

COVID - TE KAPU O WAITAHA COVID POLICY

New variants, and reports of COVID within our communities has meant a review of Trust COVID policy under the new traffic light system. All manuhiri will now be required to show their VACCINE PASS when visiting staff at the office, compulsory wearing of a mask, and scanning in at Reception still remains. VACCINE PASSES will also be mandatory for any large gatherings held by the Trust no matter where those are being held.

GRANTS SUB-COMMITTEE

The Trust would like to thank all those who put their expression of inetrest forward for the Grants sub-committee. Lyn Naki has been appointed and accepted this role for the next 3 years. Following the 3 year period, there will be another opportunity for whanau to apply, or re-apply. This opportunity will benefit growing governance capacity into the future, as well as enabling whanau to participate in the deciison making of grant allocations.

POU ARAHI TAIAO - Funded by Jobs For Nature (Operations)

We are pleased to announce the appointment of Mokoera Te Amo, who will be responsble for the oversight of Waitaha environmental strategy. He will also manage kaitiaki projects, and represent Waitaha on matters that affect us in forums with Local Government and other agencies. Mokoera will work closely with other Waitaha representatives on various boards, and committee such as Punohu (Mauao) and Maru (Local Government forums & Kaituna). This role was made possible through Jobs For Nature funded by DOC.

HOUSING CO-ORDINATOR

Veroni Leota, has accepted a secondment to the role of housing co-ordinator for a fixed term. This will help progress the plan that was developed on the back of the housing SUMMIT earlier this year. Rondell Reihana will also work alongside Veroni to support whanau by running workshops, preparation of paper work, and co-rdination of services and resources needed. The first meeting will be advertised in the New Year.

KAITIAKI - TE MAUNGA O OTAWA

Two Full Time Kaitiaki positions will become available in the New Year for kaitiaki on Otawa. The focus will be to ensure a safe passage for many species such as kokako, kiwi, and others, whose breeding, and survial is more often cut short by introduced preditors. KAITIAKI TAIAO - Funded by Jobs for Nature (Operations)

A further position alongside Mokoera will be advertised in the New Year. This is a fixed term position for 2.5 years and is fulltime. A post will be uploaded to the Trust Facebook, and website when this is advertised mid January 2022.

DRIVERS LICENCES

PRIMARY-SECONDARY -HIGH SCHOOL GRANTS

Following input by whanau input to the Statement of Intent in 2020, the Board approved an additional grant allocation for Waitaha whanau with tamariki in schools. The purpose of the grant ranged from School Uniforms, to school stationary, and fees. To date 38 grants has been awarded to eligible Waitaha tamariki (included under parent/gaurdian on the Trust register).

In addition, we also contributed to the cost of kapa wananga for 4 Waitaha mokopuna attending Maungatapu Primary school.
