WAITAHA TIKANGA TAIAO WANANGA



The Taiao team has recently developed a mauri model to guide the monitoring of the health of Otawa and Maungaruahine. 6 wananga will be held over the remainder of the year which will include also tikanga in relation to Tangaroa (the marine costal). These wananaga will help ensure the integrity to Whakairinga korero principles in relation to the Treaty Settlement Claim. !st wananga is Sunday 28th August Hei Marae commencing 9.00am. NAU MAI.

PATAKA KAI PROJECT



Waitaha, and Tapuika are part of a pilot shceme for Te Maru O Kaituna River Auhtority - Pataka Kai project. This involves mahi to determine a baseline of aquatic species and eco systems of what may have existed in the past. The focus will be to help improve the natural habitat and fish species. More importantly is that Waitaha and Tapuika has been given the opportunity to participate and lead this project, via a small contract.

WAIARI



The final buildings and pipes are starting to take shape on the Waiāri Water Supply intake facility and the plant. A tour is being planned for iwi and the wider community early next year. Starting Monday 15 August, there will be traffic management in place on Poplar Lane, traffic will be reduced to 1 lane, the re-commissioning work is expected to be completed 22.08.2022.

TE UKU O TAKAKOPIRI



Papamoa Regional Park upgrades Progress to date; Site blessing by Joshua Te Kani, Mokoera Te Amo, saw the commencement of construction for the new car park, March 2022. Aroha Ririnui was the cultural monitor onsite for this project. We have also requested Matariki at the summit for 2023.

NEW TE PUKE SUBDIVISION DEVELOPMENTS



As land runs out in Papamoa, we are seeing some significant new housing developments in Te Puke. One development located at the end of Dunlop Road plans to build 320 houses. This development was named by Whareoteriri as Te Mania. Street names have been provided by our koeke and submitted to the developer. Wharekonehu is also the cultural monitor on this site. These opportunities add another dimension to Waitaha past and present.

COMMERCIAL PRIORITIES

The key priority areas for the Directors; is to get the retirement village consent. Plan changes, introduced GOVT policies, and remedial works required on the land has impacted time, and initial proposals. These matters are being worked through with a number of parties. Meetings have also been held with WBOPDC CEO to indicate interest in any commercial opportunities, some have been identified in the District Plan. Directors will continue to maximise returns from Kopuroa, considering GA License transfer for better returns. Further updates to come.

KAITIAKI PROJECTS

Otawa pest control project is underway with tracks and traps being established. A suite of training has occured over the past few months, including GIS mapping tools, Health and safety, and First Aid. Meanwhile Maungaruahine mahi continues. Future focus in the coming months will be signage, formalising tracks, and car park upgrade areas. This mahi is in addition to the upcoming wananga for mauri monitoring.

ADMINISTERING CONSERVATION LANDS

The Trust is responsible for administering Otawa, and Maungaruahine along with other conservation areas. We will work toward greater management and control within the capacity of iwi administration and kaitiaki. Our aim is to make sure our ngahere is thriving, is safe, and not being exploited, but looked after and respected by all.
