I was raised with my kuia and koro in Waitaha from birth. Sitting in our whare tupuna and listening to Koro Bole, Koro Buddy, Koro Monty, Koro Sam I was privileged to witness Waitaha tikanga and values in action.

My childhood consisted of doing crazy stunts, jumps and wheelies on my BMX, mountain bike on the tennis courts at the marae and then on my motorbikes on the road, annoying Aunty Roma, Aunty Hangaia, Uncle Mackie and Aunty Mulu.

We had a great childhood on the road playing fly (An advanced agility game requiring 10 sticks and the legs of a kangaroo) before school, hens and hounds across the neighbourhood, making bows and arrows with willow branches, fishing line and bracken fern, riding uncle Mackie's horses to the High School Baths, touch at Haraki, maize huts, playing longball on Uncle Wehi's lawn and doing bombs and swimming in our awa.

The memories and connections I have of our road and our people are awesome and it's those memories of our people and that strong connection to the people and the whenua that form the basis of what I want to bring to the board table.

I remember sitting in our whare tupuna as a child listening to our paepae who were a formidable force that oozed mana. Koro Buddy, Koro Monty, Koro Sam, Koro Niko, Koro Tukaha, Koro Mackie, Koro Tame, Papa, Koro Bole who all carried themselves with such charisma and strength.

The memories of Nanny Maggie, Nanny Waiwharangi, Nanny Te Akau (Dynamite), Nanny Gwen, Nanny Sally, Nanny Piko, Aunty Katie, Aunty Hangaia, Aunty Roma, Nanny Googie, Nanny Josie and the smoked filled card rooms.

In those days it was done by the people for the people! It is my hope that we can bring their hopes and dreams to life by again working with the people for the people.
